**ProMedica Memorial Hospital is a 43 licensed-bed hospital that continues to offer comprehensive, compassionate medical care to the communities we serve.**

### Recent highlights include:

- **Memorial Hospital** welcomed three new providers in 2022. **Jaclyn Jezak, CNP**, behavioral health; **Muhamid Asif, MD**, family medicine; and **Mennatallah Omar, MD**, general surgery.
  - Dr. Omar is the region's **ONLY** female general surgeon and specializes in general surgery with a subspecialty in minimally invasive/advanced GI surgery.
- **Memorial Hospital** was awarded a three-year term of accreditation in MRI as the result of a recent review by the American College of Radiology (ACR). The hospital implemented its new **1.5T MAGNETOM Sola MRI machine** in January, 2022, that uses all new BioMatrix technology to automatically adjust to a patient's height and weight for shorter scan times, fewer rescans, and predictable scheduling.
- Earned **The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval®** and the **American Stroke Association's Heart-Check mark** for Primary Stroke Certification.
- **New services** are now offered to the community that include **spine care** and the state-of-the art **surgical robot** that has enhanced efficiency and accuracy while allowing for a faster recovery, less blood loss, fewer post-surgical complications and reduced scarring and pain.
- **Memorial Hospital** was the first hospital in the ProMedica system to distribute naran kits to anyone who may be at risk of accidental overdose, at no cost. These kits were provided by the **PEND Project** — a ProMedica naran distribution program funded by a grant from Ohio Department of Health to distribute the kits.
- Memorial Hospital received an **"A" Fall 2022 Hospital Safety Grade** from The Leapfrog Group. This national distinction celebrates several of ProMedica's hospitals achievements in protecting hospital patients from preventable harm and errors.
- The **Dorothy L. Kern Cancer Center** provided nearly **10,000** treatments to patients in need of radiation, chemotherapy, and infusion (non-chemotherapy) in 2022. This was an increase of approximately **650** total treatments in 2021.
